Dear Janell,

Thank you for taking the time to share your views on women's athletics.

For years, the previous administration and progressive movement actively advanced policies that allowed men to compete in women's sports, undermining fairness, safety, and opportunity for female athletes. That injustice against women and girls ended the moment I took office.

One of my first actions as President was signing an Executive Order to ensure that only biological females can compete in women's sports. My Administration is fully enforcing Title IX as it was originally written to protect equal opportunity for women and girls. Any school, college, or athletic association that fails to comply will lose access to federal funding. In July, I also proudly signed an Executive Order to ensure that colleges preserve—and, where possible, expand—scholarship and roster opportunities for student athletes in all sports, including in Olympic and non-revenue programs, so that college athletics remain a uniquely American institution.

Under my leadership, women can once again compete in fair and safe sports, earn scholarships based on merit, break records without fear of erasure, and pursue excellence with the confidence that their achievements will be honored and protected. I will continue to defend the integrity of women's sports, restore common sense to our Government and our public square, and protect opportunities for women and girls to achieve the American Dream.

Thank you again for writing. May God bless you, and may He continue to bless the United States of America.
